

Canada 1867-1918 Research Project

You will be responsible for researching an assigned topic showing the change and growth in one particular area of Canadian Society during the period between 1867 and 1918, or a topic relating to Canada's involvement in the First World War. You may work individually or in groups of up to five members. At the end of the four-week work period, each group or student will be responsible for presenting their findings for the class.

Presentations will take the following format:

1. Oral Presentation – minimum 15 minutes, may include audio and/video components (not more than 5 minutes in total)
2. Written Study Notes – summarizing your findings and recording key facts. This note must be a maximum of two pages, as it will be photocopied for the entire class.
3. Visual Aids – to assist in your oral presentation. This may include any of the following: maps, graphs, charts, models, photos, overheads, slideshow, video, audio, etc.

Timetable:

Project work will be completed during class hours and as homework. In-class time may be used for organization and research. You will have access to the internet and computer lab. During the final week, class time will be given for rehearsal of the presentations.

Assessment:

You will receive a group mark for your entire presentation, including all required components. The marking rubric is attached to this outline. You will receive an individual mark on your portion of the oral presentation. You will be assessed on your ability to use time wisely, and accomplish tasks. You will have an opportunity to complete both peer and self-evaluations throughout the project process. Forms are also attached.
