1	A song identified with a particular nation, often sung at special occasions; in Canada, the English version starts with, "O Canada! Our home and native land!"	Order of Canada
2	A large rodent that eats through trees to feed on bark and build dams. This animal has two visible large front teeth.	Anthem
3	A unique image of a person, corporation, or a country that contains various symbolic meanings.	Curling
4	This item is worn by kings and queens. It is a symbol of Canada's government, the legislatures, the courts, the police, and the military.	English
5	A game played on ice in which large, round and flat stones are slid across the ice. Players use brooms to sweep the surface to control the stones' speed and direction. At the 2014 Winter Olympics, Canada won two gold medals in this competition.	Crown
6	The language spoken by Anglophones; one of the official languages in Canada.	Victoria Cross
	The language spoken by Francophones; one of the official languages in Canada	National Holidays
8	A piece of cloth attached to a pole used as a symbol of a country, a province, or a territory.	Maple Leaf
9	A game played on ice by two teams of six skaters who use angled sticks to push a small rubber disk (called the puck) into the opposing team's net; the most popular winter sport in Canada.	Coat of Arms
10	The leaf of a tree that grows all over Canada and changes its colours in the autumn; the tree is also known for its sweet syrup.	Motto
11	A short phrase that is meaningful to a group of people because it captures their beliefs or values.	Parliament
12	Days when the country celebrates or remembers a special occasion; these days are also free from work.	Beaver
13	An award or an honour for people who give to their society and improve it.	French
14	A national body of elected and appointed people with the power to make laws in a country; in Canada, it includes the House of Commons and the Senate.	Flag
15	The highest military award in Canada; given for bravery; it was started by Queen Victoria in 1856	Hockey
