- 2. How were prisoners treated in the San Quentin jail?
- 3. Name one way that Bill and his mother Harriet were similar.
- 4. Is there any significance to the fact that there are only male historians in the video? Explain.
- 5. Why is it important to examine a range of historical materials (as opposed to just one)?
- 6. Describe life in California during the late 1800s.
- 7. Identify and describe the "bachelor cult of masculinity."
- 8. Why did Bill earn a reputation for being a gentleman during the 1871 stage coach robbery? What about his reputation as a Robin Hood style thief? Are any criminals today seen as heroes or heroines?
- 9. Who did Bill fall in love with? Why was this a significant milestone in his life?
- 10. What information did Pinkerton's detective agency have about Bill?
- 11. Who was Jake Terri? Compare him to Bill.
- 12. How did Bill rob the CPR train? Why was this robbery significant?
- 13. Why might Canadians have felt that Bill, the robber, "ain't so bad"?
- 14. Describe how the CPR was perceived by many Canadians. Why did the CPR have this reputation?
- 15. How was Bill perceived by many Canadian courts?
- 16. Explain Bill's impact on the CPR, the Canadian government, and Canadian citizens.
- 17. How did Bill manage to escape prison? What does the escape "hole" present problems?
- 18. Why do you think Miner is part of *The Canadians* biography series? Does he deserve this? Explain your opinion.
