



Toronto Damage May Reach \$100 Millions

FEAR ONTARIO STORM TOLL 93



36 Missing In Toronto Flood Area

TORONTO (CP)—The death toll stood at 91 today and bodies still were being recovered but as rescuers cleared in the flood-stricken Hamber valley 34 missing persons were found safe.

Removal of these names from the lists of missing in the Friday night storm spawned by Hurricane Hazel, that lashed southern Ontario left 34 persons still unaccounted for.

At Ayrview disaster workers resumed their grueling search for bodies in washed houses and water-filled cellars. The government search toll was expected to mount soon.

Most of the missing listed today had been included in a list of 37 announced at midnight by officials in the western suburbs of Hamilton, where the Hamber flood took its heaviest toll.

Clear, cool weather aided the searches when rain Monday night was the first for many since yester's rainfall turned the Hamber into a roaring flood.





Building of the Trans-Canada Pipeline, mid-1950s






